- ii) Lakhs of People Benefitted with Primary Health & Family Welfare Services: With support of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt of India & USAID, Dr Ahmed has designed and implemented a pioneering Project-PVOH-II Project (1991-1996) & has taken Primary Health & Family Welfare Services to several Lakhs of people in remote inaccessible areas of Assam & Meghalaya border emphasising on tribal women and children for which his services were highly appreciated and awarded by USAID.
- iii) Comprehensive HIV/AIDS Prevention Programmes: Conceived, designed & Implemented several Comprehensive HIV/AIDS prevention programmes in the community providing Care & Support Programmes for People Living With HIV/AIDS (PLWHA) with Opportunistic infections including TB.

#### 34. Impact of work done

Work done by Dr.Ahmed contributed in achieving several positive impacts in Assam, Meghalaya and other states of North East India where he worked since 1990-91:

- 1. WORLD BANK REPORT Described Dr Ahmed's AIDS Prevention Society as a"Model in the country": World Bank Report and Observations of AIDS Prevention Society(APS) highlighted their successful community intervention. Senior key Official of the World Bank, Mr Michael F Carter, the Country Director being impressed with his first visit has again revisited APS in 2005, this time with a team of 5 officials and made an elaborate extensive field visits to several Projects MTCT Project (Mother-to-child-transmission Prevention of HIV Project awarded based on an International competitive bid by Brussels, supported by the European Commission), The Truckers Project (supported by British Govt- DfID), Project Sakhi (CRS, US supported), IDU Project & Healthy Highway Project (CORDAID, Netherlands supported), SLIP Street Level Intervention (US State Deptt supported) and Health Centres and Community Centres (BRO Collaboration). Along with the World Bank Report came a letter to Dr Ahmed noting their observations which were very encouraging for 150+ APS team where the World Bank suggested scaling up the positive impact of APS as a "Model in the country".
- 2. Skilled Health Workers created: Hundreds of Nurses- ANMs, Counsellors, Female Health Workers, Peer educators were created for strengthening health delivery system
- 3. Health services made available in most inaccessible areas in Assam-Meghalaya border in North East India achieving mother and child health care in those areas
- 4. Child Immunization against Preventable Diseases were massive example being 100% coverage of Pulse Polio in Kamrup District and other districts in Assam.
- 5. Massive awareness of general population on HIV/ AIDS achieved.
- 6. State Govt Policy on AIDS adopted and Dr Ahmed played an important Advocacy Role Free treatment with drugs for HIV/AIDS, their transportation , women and children , orphans care and support achieved .
- 7. Free Treatment on HIV/AIDS: Advocacy by Dr Ahmed contributed in making available Free treatment of HIV and Opportunistic Infections.
- 8. Stigma against People with HIV/ AIDS reduced . High risk taking population like Injecting Drug Users, Sex Workers, Truckers, Migrant Population, Men Having Sex with Men ( MSM) , Street Children were much more aware about HIV/AIDS taking precautions ultimately reducing the infection considerably . Health literacy improved—health related knowledge, attitudes, motivation, confidence, behavioural intentions and personal skills concerning healthy lifestyles, as well as knowledge of where to go and what to do to obtain health services were achieved .
- 9. Social action and influence Dr Ahmed succeeded in achieving community participation, community empowerment, social norms and public opinion.
- 10. Healthy public policies and organisational practices implementation of policy statements, legislation/regulations, resource allocation, supportive organisational practices and settings experiencing enhanced engagement with health promotion programs.

11. 'Second level' health promotion impacts achieved which included those relating to healthier lifestyles, more effective health services, and healthier environments.

#### 35. Contribution to society

Dr Ahmed has made invaluable contribution to the community through his involvement in several NGOs which he established with his colleagues from the community. He formed the AAIS Clinic, Assam Imdadiya Hospital Committee, AIDS Prevention Society (APS), AIDS Literacy Society and was actively associated with other NGOs like the Lions Club, Friends-Of-Assam-andSeven-Sisters, North-East-India-Harm-Reduction-Network, Sachetan Nagaric Mancha, Bosco Reach Out and many community based organisations:

- 1. Since 1982, Dr Ahmed was involved in providing free health services to the most downtrodden and economically disadvantaged population dwelling in the urban slums, railway tracks and the street dwellers in Guwahati city in Assam.
- 2. He mobilized the community in addressing the needs of the population in establishing low cost sanitation, safe drinking water, Immunuzation etc in collaboration with UNICEF in Guwahati City, Assam.
- 3. Dr Ahmed established a Charitable AAIS Clinic with his colleagues and with his personal contribution which was inaugurated by the Chief Minister of Assam in 1985 and treated lakhs of economically disadvantaged, homeless, destitute women and children in the society over the years.
- 4. With his HIV/AIDS prevention programmes of his organisation AIDS Prevention Society (APS), he reached out very effectively to the general population, students in school, colleges, universities, youth clubs, Mahila Samitis, Women's Organisation, Lions Club, NGOs, semi government organisations, security forces and law enforcement agencies etc and addressed the common man in the society
- 5. He was invited by the World Bank to share the success of APS as a civil society in India responding to the HIV/AIDS epidemic in North East India, with senior officials and Country Directors of South Asia Region of the World Bank in New Delhi Country Office.
- 6. AIDS Prevention Society(APS) mission is to prevent and control spread of HIV /AIDS /STDs and to provide care and support to those who are already infected with

various Opportunistic Infections - of which TB among the HIV being most important in more than 90%. Community action aims to encourage and empower communities (both geographical areas and communities of interest) to build their capacity to develop and sustain improvements.

- 7. He worked with the high risk groups for HIV with, Injecting Drug Users, Sex Workers, Truck Drivers, Migrant population, Street dwellers etc. He established Drop in centres for them, Rehab programmes, and even alternate income source for sex workers and trained them with skill development.
- 8. The ultimate goal of health promotion programs of Dr Ahmed is to improve health outcomes for communities. Health outcomes include improvements in quality of life, function, independence, equity, mortality and morbidity. Health outcomes are a function of

health promotion activities and a range of other social, environmental and biological determinants.

- 9. Through the "Sachetan Nagoric Mancha", Guwahati, Assam, of which he is the Chief Adviser, he emphasised the collective responsibility of the community in organising special functions for Assamese "Bihu", Durga Puja, Republic Day, Independence Day celebrations, "Swachh Bharat" Abhiyaan etc.
- **36.** <u>RESEARCH</u>: Dr Ahmed has to his credit conducting several research programmed on health and HIV/AIDS in the country supported by the US State Deptt, British DFID, European Commission, Health Ministry of Netherlands, Swedish SIDA, CORDAID, CRS of US and others, including initiating the Opioid-Substitution-Therapy for drug users in Punjab, India.
- 37. <u>US STATE DEPTT INVITATION AS IVLP</u>: The US Government and Administration of President Bill Clinton invited Dr Ahmed to the US for a month long programme in1996 under the "International Visitors Program" as a Visiting Scientist to study HIV/AIDS Prevention and Public Health Issues in the US specially designed for Medical Professionals & was in CDC, Atlanta, NIH, Bethesda, the Executive Office of the President at the White House, the Capitol Hill, San Francisco General Hospital, Walter Reed Army Medical Centre, University of Pittsburgh Medical Center and many institutions in several States of the US. Besides, his professional commitments,
- **38.** <u>COLLABORATIONS</u>: Dr Ahmed has been also proactively associated with Lions Club, Friends-Of-Assam-andSeven-Sisters, North-East-India-Harm-Reduction-Network, AIHC, Nagaric Mancha and many social organizations. He has been actively working with NASA, USA on several Projects and made a film on NASA's International Space Station with NE students interacting with Astronaut Mike Fincke.
- **39.** CULTURAL ACTIVITIES: Besides, Dr Ahmed is closely associated with the cultural world as an actor and a singer. He has acted in several Assamese Films from Child Artiste(1959) to Lead Roles. His films include -Puberoon, Parinam, Basundhara, Khov, Bhoga Khireeki and others. He received the State Award for his acting as Best Actor in Negative Role in "Basundhara", an Assamese Feature Film which won the National Film Award "Rajat Kamal" being the Best Regional Film in 2012.
- 40. As a member of IAPAC Attended the The International Association of Providers of AIDS Care (IAPAC) hosted " **The 90-90-90 Targets Workshop**" on July  $22^{nd}$  &  $23^{rd}$ , 2017 held at Paris, France as a Delegate Member from India at this International Meeting sponsored by UNAIDS.

The Summit sponsored by IAPAC in collaboration with the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS), the Global Network of People Living with HIV (GNP+), the Foundation for AIDS Research (amfAR), and the Geneva University Hospitals (HUG).reflected a pathway towards the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) of ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2030. In support of connecting the dots between attaining the UNAIDS 90-90-90 targets and controlling the HIV epidemic, the Summit clearly defined the meaning of "HIV epidemic control" including sufficient nuance to allow for the heterogeneity of the AIDS

response. In addition, the summit examined proposed new metrics for assessing progress in national and subnational HIV epidemic responses.

## EXPERIENCES IN IMPLEMENTING HEALTH PROGRAMMES IN DEVELOPING COUNTRY INCLUDING EXPERIENCES ON HIV/AIDS PROGRAMMES:

Dr.Ahmed has carried out several studies in the field of HIV/AIDS since the early years of the epidemic in the region since 1989-90. He has conducted several studies and surveys among different groups of people from the beginning of the AIDS epidemic in North East India on behalf of AIDS Prevention Society (APS) of which he is the founder Chairman & Medical Director . APS has undertaken and conducted several studies and surveys on behavior pattern of groups which includes Injecting Drug Users (IDUs), Sex Workers, Truck Drivers entering North East India and among youth, Students and General Population. Awareness programmes on HIV/AIDS and Drug Abuse have been undertaken for various groups of people including students and youth, women, sex workers, truck drivers, defence personnel and health workers besides the general population at large. The KABP study among the Truckers conducted by Dr.Ahmed in 1991 has been one of the pioneering studies in the country which has caused immense concern to WHO-GPA then and subsequently for the first time a countrywide halt point study was undertaken supported by the British ODA. He has formulated several HIV prevention strategies and implemented various intervention programmes to slow down the epidemic of HIV/AIDS in the region.

As Chairman of AIDS Prevention Society (APS), he was responsible for formulating project proposals, designing strategies, supervising teams, administering, implementing projects, conducting operational activities, developing and implementing the work plan, managing the work including the financial and human resources of the organisation and developing processes to improve work flow effectiveness and human resource productivity and formulating management information systems (MIS) for monitoring and evaluation of programmes and implemented the following projects in India: -

#### ■ <u>INTERVENTION WITH INJECTING DRUG USERS, OTHER DRUG</u> USERS AND THEIR SEXUAL PARTNERS IN GUWAHATI, ASSAM

Dr. Ahmed was responsible for management of one of the first harm reduction projects for Injecting Drug Users in the country along with Manipur & Nagaland states of North East India . Based on the Outreach Model, the project through trained Peer Educators provided services with the principles of Harm Reduction for the Injecting Drug Users and those Drug Users at risk of injecting and sharing injecting equipment & their sex partners He was responsible for implementation of one of the first Harm Reduction Projects for Injecting Drug Users in the country supported by NACO, Govt. of India and the Swedish SIDA and implemented in the North East India in 1993-94 and substance abuse treatment . This project is located in Guwahati City in Assam State of India.

#### **■ HALTING AIDS ON HIGHWAYS** –

The KABP study among the Truckers conducted by Dr.Ahmed in 1991 has been one of the pioneering studies in the country which has caused immense concern to WHO-GPA and subsequently a nation wide Truckers Project has been undertaken in the country since 1995 supported by NACO & subsequently by ODA/DFID of the British High Commission. Besides this behavioral study of the truck drivers, a study on the prevalence of STDs among the truck drivers was undertaken in 1994-95.

■ <u>HEALTHY HIGHWAY PROJECT</u> — One of the first Targetted Intervention Projects in the country for Truck Drivers & Helpers for prevention of STD/HIV/AIDS along NH 37.

#### **■ HIGHWAY HEALTH MANAGEMENT PROJECT (HHMP)** –

APS has successfully completed the first phase of three years of this ambitious project which is the first of its kind in the country. It is unique in the sense that three partner NGOs of the region APS, Bosco Reach Out (Legal Holder) and National Alliance Mission are jointly implementing this project where Primary Health and Family Welfare Services are integrated with HIV/AIDS prevention and STD prevention and Management along the National Highways 37,40 & 44 covering major areas along the highways in Meghalaya . The project is implemented covering a distance of over 300 Km covering the population residing along the highways and within one kilometer on either side of the highway with special emphasis on women , children and youth and also the mobile population on the highway including Truckers and helpers .

## ■ RAJIV GANDHI WORKFORCE FOR PREVENTION, CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF AIDS IN NORTH EAST INDIA –

The objective of this project is to make available a mutually supportive network of GPs (General Medical Practitioners) and NGOs (Non Governmental Organization) in North East India and to facilitate the actual collaborative process in establishing the network. The area of operation are in the States of Assam, Meghalaya, Nagaland and Mizoram. APS has trained more than 600 GPs & NGOs under the project in these states . APS is implementing a Mobile Counselling Project in the urban slums of the city providing services on HIV/AIDS to the slum dwellers of the city.

## RAJIV GANDHI MOBILE COUNSELLING PROJECT FOR HIV/AIDS IN GUWAHATI CITY, ASSAM IN NORTH EAST INDIA

- STREET LEVEL INTERVENTION FOR AIDS AWARENESS AMONG GENERAL POPULATION IN GUWAHATI CITY This project has been very successfully implemented in Guwahati City in Assam . The project was subsequently supported for two years by the US State Department .
- SMALL FAMILY NORMS PROJECT

#### ■ <u>TELEPHONE HOTLINE COUNSELING SERVICES FOR</u> HIV/AIDS –

"NACO –APS AIDS HOTLINE"- For the first time in North East India, a Telephone Hotline Counseling Services Project for HIV/AIDS information was sanctioned by National AIDS Control Organisation to APS.

**Integrated Counselling & Testing Centre** (**ICTC**) has been established in the APS Clinic. Since early 2007, the toll free number has been changed to "1051" and an interactive voice response services has been established by Assam State AIDS Control Society in collaboration with AMTRON at APS Head Office.

- PROJECT SAKHI (AN INTERVENTION PROJECT AMONG SEX WORKERS) One of the first peer based intervention project for prevention of HIV/AIDS/STD among the sex workers in the North East India have been initiated by APS in Guwahati City in Assam . The project supported by Assam State AIDS Control Society has been started from March 2000. The project is currently supported by Catholic Relief Services (CRS) & rehabilitation programme for sex workers of Guwahati city has been initiated by APS and Self Help Groups have been formed.
- **TRAINING**: Besides implementing the various project mentioned above APS is also involved in conducting various training programmes for health workers on Primary Health, reproductive and sexual health and HIV/AIDS/STD by trained and experienced resource team.
- Ahmed is responsible for implementing several targeted intervention projects in the community for slowing down the epidemic of HIV/AIDS and in providing care & support services including treatment related support services to PLWHA (People Living With HIV/AIDS) in North East India, providing HIV/AIDS treatment & promoting adherence interventions & techniques. APS Chairman, Dr.Ahmed is also involved in providing Counseling, care and Support services and Advocacy for people living with HIV/AIDS. Clinical Care to people living with HIV/AIDS is provided. Management of OIs & ARV therapy is provided to PLWHA.
  - Care & Support with Counselling services for PLWHA, home based care & nutritional counselling, & family counselling
  - ♦ As an Advisory Board Member of ANP+ ( Network of Positive People ) & founder member of NGO networks in the region like NEIHRN ( North East India Harm Reduction Network ) & NE NGO Network , APS is currently responsible for capacity building of NGO partners in the region .
- <u>IEC MATERIALS PRODUCTION</u>: APS is involved in development of a variety of IEC materials .APS Chairman, is Editor in Chief of AIDSCAN- a quarterly newsletter of APS.

- <u>LEGAL</u>, <u>ETHICAL</u> <u>AND</u> <u>HUMAN</u> <u>RIGHTS</u>: The Legal, Ethical and Human Rights Division of APS is functioning very effectively under the Division Chief Dr. S. Rajkhowa of the Law Department of Guwahati University. He is organizing series of workshop involving several key persons of the related field Lawyers, Judges and Human Rights Activists of the region.
- NATIONAL WORKSHOP OF NGOs ON HIV/AIDS : Chaired the Plenary Session "Best Intervention Practices in the NGO Sector" in the first National Workshop of NGOs on HIV/AIDS organized by National AIDS Control Organisation in New Delhi in January 1998 .
- <u>NGO ADVISORY COMMITTEE</u>: APS Chairman, Dr.Ahmed, was a member of the NGO Advisory Committee (NAC) of the DFID British High Commission supported national Healthy Highway Project. The chairman has conducted as a NAC member several studies and formulated several programmes including the STD Drug Policy for the Healthy Highway Project.
- PRIMARY HEALTH CARE IN URBAN SLUMS: APS Chairman, Dr.Ahmed is regularly conducting Health Camps in the urban slums of Guwahati City and conducted several training programmes for the Traditional Birth Attendants and more than 140 TBAs were trained and provided the Delivery Kits supported by Govt of Assam & UNICEF.
- <u>UNAIDS STUDY TOUR TO THAILAND</u>: APS Chairman, Dr.Ahmed was selected by UNAIDS to be a member of the study team of NACO and UNAIDS who visited Thailand in July 1997 for better understanding of the AIDS epidemic in Thailand and the response to the epidemic both by the Thai Government and other Agencies including Voluntry organisations. Since then a number of collaboration activities are taking place. On an invitation from the Thai NGOs APS chairman visited Bangkok again in February 1999 for studying and collaborating on the sex workers project in that city.
- CLINICAL MANAGEMENT TRAINING ON AIDS: APS Chairman, Dr.Ahmed successfully completed the Training on Clinical Management of HIV Disease & AIDS at Hospital Brussais in Paris, France under Prof. Michel Kazatchkine one of the most renowned AIDS physician and scientist of France in March-April 1998. Based on this experience and in collaboration with the State Physician responsible for AIDS Management (PRAM), Govt. of Assam APS have already started home base care for people with HIV in Guwahati City. Nutritional Counseling has been one prominent feature of the programme. APS plans to expand the Care and Support services to people with HIV/AIDS through a well designed programme in the near future.
- <u>UNICEF SUPPORTED URBAN BASIC SERVICES PROGRAMME</u>: APS has been conducting regular health education sessions in the urban slums of Guwahati City through its staff and volunteers, who are being posted with updated training and IEC materials. In eighteen urban slum areas of the city modern first aid boxes with supplies were provided to each slum community with training on their use. Under the UNICEF sponsored UBSP Programme of the Municipal Administration

Department of Govt. of Assam it has improved services in several urban slums of the city where low cost sanitary services were installed.

- INTEGRATED HEALTH SERVICES PROJECT(IHSP)FOR PREVENTION OF MOTHER TO CHILD TRANSMISSION(PPTCT) OF HIV/AIDS IN ASSAM, INDIA SUPPORTED BY EUROPEAN COMMISSION(EC): AIDS Prevention Society, Assam, has initiated from 1st March 2002 implementation of an ambitious five year project in Guwahati, Assam, first of its kind in the North East India "the Integrated Health Services Project for Prevention of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV in Guwahati, Assam". A major part of the project is supported by the European Commission for which an MoU was signed between the AIDS Prevention Society & the European Commission in December 2001 & APS was responsible for implementation of the project which included several scientific research based on several issues related to MTCT.

The overall goal of the project is to prevent Mother to Child Transmission of HIV among women of child bearing age in Guwahati, Assam state of North East India. The Project proposes to provide integrated health services to women of child bearing age and young women for prevention of Maternal to Child Transmission of HIV. Under the Project, preventive strategy formulated would provide field based intensive education, information and communication about HIV/AIDS and its prevention to women of child bearing age specially young women over a period of 5 years in identified urban slum and semi urban areas of Guwahati city and its adjoining areas in Assam in North East India so that they can protect themselves from the infection. There would be strengthening of Maternal to Child Health Services so that Mother to Child Transmission prevention of HIV can be integrated. VCT services will be integrated with MCH services during ante natal visits through four health centres established within the project and will be offered after the intensive education session so that HIV infected women can reduce pregnancies and those who are already infected and pregnant can be provided ARV (Anti Retroviral) prophylaxis during pregnancy and provide ARV(Anti Retroviral) prophylaxis to the infant supported by Infant Feeding Counselling VCT will ensure women to take informed decisions about safer sex, having children and a healthy life style which will be linked to family planning services and to prenatal and obstetric services.

As the prevalence of HIV in ante natal clinic in Assam is still very low , the objective of the project is to reduce acquisition of HIV/STD by women of child bearing age by

enhancing the knowledge about basic facts and prevention of HIV/STDs and encouraging them to adopt safer behaviours as part of Primary Prevention , Strengthening MCH services & integrating VCT during ante natal visits,Reduce pregnancy among infected women, Reduce MTCT among infected pregnant mothers providing ARV prophylaxis ( which will be very less in number ) and counselling on breast feeding.

- <u>VCT CENTRES</u> ( ICTC ): APS Chairman has established the Voluntary Counselling & Testing Centres (VCTC) Integrated Counselling & Testing Centres at APS and another 5 VCTC which is providing services to a large number of people specially young people willing to know their HIV status.
- AIDS EDUCATION IN SCHOOLS : AIDS Prevention Society has been involved in "YOUTH & AIDS PROJECT" –AIDS Education in Schools Programme since 1994. 20 schools were covered under the project in the first phase and another 15 schools were covered under the project in the second phase . AIDS Prevention Society was involved by NACO & UNICEF in the regional planning phase for AIDS Education Programme in North East India and APS Chairman was responsible along with State AIDS Cell officials of Govt. of Assam for preparing the State Plan for AIDS Education in Schools in Assam. ## ■ <u>AIDS Vaccine Initiative & National Coalition on Health Initiatives - NCHI</u>:

As part of its comprehensive response to HIV/AIDS, the Government of India has entered into an agreement with the International AIDS Vaccine Initiative (IAVI) to develop and test AIDS Vaccines in India . Non Governmental Organisations (NGOs) in India have successfully delivered health initiative in the past and are presently at the forefront addressing multiple medical, social, legal, ethical and policy dimensions of the AIDS problem. Their participation in the vaccine development process will increase programme efficiency, maximise the utilisation of local resources and skills, secure sustainability of prevention activities and provide an opportunity to the community to play a leadership role in the AIDS vaccine research and development process. AIDS vaccine research and development will however place an increased demand on NGOs and community based organisations as new strategies, innovative approaches and different service delivery packages will be required to address the differing needs of the communities involved in the process.

The National Coalition on Health Initiatives (NCHI) is a group of six nationally networked NGOs from the high prevalence states , including representation from PLWHAs, which has come together with the primary objective of increasing community understanding and participation in the AIDS vaccine programme and other health initiatives. NCHI acknowledges the urgency and importance of preparing communities in India for an effective vaccine. The NCHI, with the help of NGOs, aims to strengthen the efforts of the AIDS vaccine programme. APS is a part of NCHI representing north east states .

#### The Objectives of the NCHI are:

- 1 Integration of HIV vaccines into existing prevention programmes of NGOs in India.
- 2 Development of a core group of NGOs interested in participating in the vaccine development process.
- 3 Mobilisation of communities by increasing awareness about safe and ethical vaccine development through widespread advocacy and information dissemination.
- 4 Act as point persons between communities and vaccine research team (s)
- 5 Build linkages with global non governmental organisations working on AIDS vaccines to share and learn each others experiences.
- New Prevention Technologies (NPT) for HIV/AIDS: The Road Ahead for India Conducted survey amongst the NGOs of Manipur, Nagaland, Mizoram & Assam in September 2009.
- Conducted A collaborative Study to assess understanding of current AIDS Vaccine Development Initiatives in India by NGOs of North East India .
- <u>SUPPORT RECEIVED</u>: Activities of AIDS Prevention Society have been made possible through the establishment of an extensive networking with various National and International Organizations.
